## **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK: MAJOR MILESTONES**

- ❖ The Department of Social Work (earlier known as the Delhi School of Social Work) was established in the year 1946 at Lucknow by the YWCA. It was then known as the National YWCA School of Social Work.
- ❖ In the year 1947, the school was shifted to Delhi. Later in 1948, it was affiliated to the University of Delhi and came to be known as Delhi School of Social Work. The institute has the distinction of being the first institution in Asia to offer a Master's Degree in Social Work.
- ❖ In April 1961, the School became a part of the University of Delhi, after which it started functioning as a Post-Graduate institution affiliated to the University.
- ❖ In 1965, Doctoral programme (leading to PhD. degree) in Social Work was started and the Department added a Pre Doctoral programme (leading to M.Phil. degree) in 1976.
- ❖ In May 1979, it became a Post-Graduate Department affiliated to the Faculty of Social Sciences of the University of Delhi.
- ❖ The Department initiated Bachelor's Degree (Honours Course) in Social Work in two constituent colleges of the University of Delhi from the academic session 1994-95.
- ❖ The Department of Social Work was granted the Department of Special Assistance status (DSA) by the University Grants Commission in 1992. The Department was also sanctioned assistance under the ASIHSS Programme.
- ❖ The Department has continued its field action programmes, established over the years to demonstrate the relevance of social work intervention in dealing with social issues and problems. It has strengthened its Centre for Child and Adolescent Well Being (renamed from Child Guidance Centre instituted in 1971), and its Centre for Community Development and Action (which was

established in Burari community in 1988 and was earlier called Gram Mahila Kendra).

- ❖ The Department undertook relief and rehabilitation action project for earthquake affected villages in Bhuj (Kutch) under the banner, University for Development Action and Integrated Learning (UDAI) during 2001-2002.
- ❖ It also executed an innovative action project UDAI –II in the flood affected villages of Bihar starting 2008.
- ❖ In 2008, NACO sanctioned the establishment of a State Training and Resource Centre at the Department.
- ❖ A Gender Resource Centre was granted by the Governing Council of Mission Convergence under the Chief Secretary, Government of NCT of Delhi to the Centre for Community Development and Action in 2009, under the auspices of the DSSW Society.
- ❖ Also in 2009, the semester system was introduced in the M.A. (Social Work) programme.
- ❖ Utthan, an extension wing of CCAW was established in August 2012, with the support of Lion Child Trust, a trust formed by Lions Club International.
- ❖ In 2014, University Grants Commission (UGC) sanctioned the status of "Centre of Advanced Study (CAS) in Social Work" to the Department of Social Work, University of Delhi for five years in this regard.
- ❖ Department of Social Work was given the responsibility of coordinating the Community Development Cell of the University of Delhi in 2015 and the *Unnat Bharat Abhiyan* in 2016.
- ❖ The Department of Social Work continues to hold the second position amongst the Social Work Institutions in India in the ranking of Outlook magazine since 2009. For the last three years the Department has been ranked number one on 'Academic Excellence' and 'Placements' in the Outlook magazine ranking.

## **I. ADDRESS BY THE HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT**

Our distinguished Chief Guest Ms. Kiran Bhatia, our eminent Guest of Honour, Mr. V.K. Tikoo, honourable guests from the University, members of the faculty, members of the non teaching staff, my dear students, ladies and gentlemen,

I wish to also share that we occupied top position in the country with respect to the two most important parameters 'Academic Achievement' and 'Placements'. We can all give ourselves a pat on our backs for achieving this feat by working together to achieve our vision and mission. I wish to thank each one of the Department constituents for this achievement, for I know that without our working together as a cohesive family, this would not have been possible. The Department also continues to enjoy the exalted status of a UGC Centre of Advanced Studies (CAS).

It gives me immense happiness to also share with you the distinguished achievements of three of our faculty members, one of whom is retired and the other two are presently with us. Professor K. D. Gangrade, our revered teacher and a founding member of this Department was honoured with the prestigious Distinguished Service Award for Retired Teachers, given to highly deserving individuals who have rendered exemplary service to the University. The Award was conferred on the occasion of the 95<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day of the University of Delhi. Thank you Prof. Gangrade for making us feel so proud! You certainly deserve all accolades for your unparalleled contribution to the Department and the University!

The noteworthy elevation of Prof. Manoj Kumar Jha as an Honourable Member of the Rajya Sabha makes our hearts swell with pride. This is indeed an extremely proud achievement, not only for him personally, but for all of us at the Department and the University of Delhi. We feel privileged and inspired with this most distinguished achievement of our colleague. It demonstrates to us that a relentless crusade for social

justice and a commitment to translate classroom teaching into 'real' work with the most vulnerable constituencies is not only possible, but also integral to the core of social work education and practice. Once again, on behalf of the Department fraternity, I wish to extend our heartfelt congratulations and best wishes to Prof. Jha. We not only look forward to him emerging as one of the most forthcoming and distinguished debaters at the Parliament, but also to his spearheading many meaningful changes in policies and programmes that are so crucial for fostering social justice and human rights.

The third faculty member that I wish to congratulate is Prof. Sanjai Bhatt. I feel proud to share that he has been conferred the Prof. V.K.R.V Lifetime Award in Social Sciences which has been given by the Indian Social Science Association. He has also achieved the special distinction of becoming the Ambassador for the Global Social Service Workforce Alliance headquartered at U.S.A. Prof. Bhatt has added more glory to the Department, and we are indeed indebted to him for the same.

The year 2017-18 has been a very productive year for us, as it was marked by multifaceted initiatives; collaborative endeavours; innovative efforts of student learning and faculty enrichment; as also need based developmental interventions. The Department played a pioneering role in hosting a diversity of initiatives independently, and in partnership with several governmental and non- governmental organisations. We continued to strive towards building an enabling environment that encourages self exploration and self expression among the students and research scholars, stimulating their young minds to nurture a culture that respects hard work, perseverance, diversity and inclusion.

All the three academic programmes being run by the Department, namely, M.A., M.Phil and PhD programmes continued to function with great dynamism. We are indeed proud to share that like each year; last year too we received a record number of applications for our PhD programme. It was only after a very rigorous admission regimen that the best out of them were able to secure admission. Presently, the Department has 59 scholars registered under different supervisors for their Doctoral Research. During this year, five PhD scholars submitted their thesis. They are Mr.



Ravi Ranjan, Mr. H Arokiaraj, Ms. Gyanwati, Ms. Swati Srivastav and Ms. Bhawana Malik. Ms. Mali Devi was awarded her PhD degree during this period and I heartily congratulate her for the successful completion of her doctoral work. Furthermore, three scholars are awaiting their viva voce examination. Prof. Sanjai Bhatt continued to spearhead the PhD programme with his dynamic leadership.

In the current context, the M.Phil Programme of the Department has twenty five scholars, out of which eleven were admitted to the M.Phil programme this year and a total of fourteen scholars are pursuing their M.Phil (Part II). Eleven students from the earlier batch successfully submitted their dissertations, and the Viva- Voce exams have also been accomplished. I am very proud to share that our research scholars have presented their work at various national and international conferences, and have also contributed articles and papers for renowned journals. Many of them have also been attending training and professional enrichment programmes. The scholars constitute important assets for the Department, as they continue to participate and support all departmental programmes and initiatives. Dr. Neena Pandey continued to render her valuable inputs to the M.Phil programme in the capacity of the M.Phil Coordinator.

Our Masters Degree Programme continues to be among the most sought after and one of the most prestigious programmes being run in the country. As many as 97 students were admitted after an arduous admission process. I am proud to share that the current batch comprises of graduates from diverse fields like Sociology, Social Work, English, Political Science, Economics, Home Science, Geography, Engineering, Management, Media and Journalism etc. Our outgoing batch of 68 students graduated from the Department in May 2017, with 33 of them obtaining a first class. All of them have either joined reputed organisations and action groups to initiate their career as human service professionals or have enrolled themselves in courses of higher learning. We offer our heartfelt wishes for a meaningful and immensely fulfilling professional trajectory to all of them.

Field work practicum continued to flourish under the Directorship of Dr. Sanjoy Roy. Apart from the intensive orientation programme, the Department provided an extra impetus to strengthen supportive field work through the organisation of many

workshops and interactive sessions. The much awaited student conference added an opportunity to the students to integrate theory and practice and engage in valuable peer learning. The rural camp to Urmul in Bikaner District was a hugely successful programme with exceptional learning outcomes. The Placement Cell of the Department played an active role in networking with various civil society organisations, public sector undertakings, consulting companies and many other agencies and institutions working in the developmental sector to facilitate them to recruit our students through the campus placement process. I feel a special thrill in sharing that we were able to achieve hundred per cent placement for all students desirous of seeking placements. Our special congratulations to Dr. Sanjoy Roy and our exceptionally hard working Placements Team for this feat!

The Department has always encouraged young achievers and has instituted several awards and scholarships to acknowledge and foster academic and co-curricular engagement. I wish to congratulate Mr. Raghwendra Singh, who is being awarded the Phyllis Gore Medal for the Best Student for all round performance. Well done Raghwendra, for not only achieving personal merit, but for also working hard to contribute to the corporate life of the Department. I also feel extremely happy to announce that Ms. Sonia Singla has received the Gyan Pandit Award for obtaining the highest marks in the M.A. Prev. examination. She also obtains the B.S. Kumedan Award for best use of library resources; the National Institute of Personnel Management Award; and the L.D. Mehta Memorial Award. Congratulations to Sonia for her extraordinary achievement! Ms. Sonia Singla and Mr Raghvendra Singh also share the award of Charudatta Scholarship. This year Ms. Janaki Devi Ahuja Memorial Award is being given to Mr. Bony George and Mr. Raghwendra Singh and the Sudhir E. Michigan Memorial Medal is being awarded to Ms. Divya Jyoti Batra.

Mr. Rahul Kapoor, one of the most active and committed students from the outgoing batch of 2017 is the recipient of Shrimati Kunda Datar Gold Medal and the Maharishi Karve Memorial Prize for securing the first position in the M.A. Final examination. Well done Rahul for making your alma mater proud! An equally meritorious distinction is that achieved by the student who scores the highest marks in field work in both the years. The prestigious Elmina Lucke Award and the Society for

Development Action Gold Medal have been awarded to Mr. Prashant Anand. Congratulations Prashant, for we know that field work is core to social work and so we really cherish your achievement! This year marks the initiation of the new Sahyog Scholarship instituted by our revered alumni Mrs. and Mr. Widge. We are indeed grateful to them for their contribution to their alma mater. This year these scholarships have been awarded to Mr. Durgesh Kumar; Mr. Vivek Kumar Agrawal; Ms. Sanchaya Jaiswal and Ms. Tanya Parihar. Another new award, instituted in the memory of Prof. Shankar H. Pathak is being given to Ms. Nairitee Sil for securing the highest marks in the course on Social Policy. Many of our other students have also received awards and commendations. I take this opportunity to applaud them and to wish them the best for their personal and professional life.

As a premier social work educational institution, the Department has also undertaken field action projects to demonstrate the relevance of social work intervention in dealing with social issues and problems. The Centre for Community Development and Action (CCDA) continued to meaningfully engage with community constituencies. Apart from implementing an array of need based and constantly evolving interventions, the CCDA team ensured multiple successful engagements at Burari, Swaroop Nagar, Shakarpura, Satya Vihar, Nathupura, Burari Garhi and Ajit Vihar. The Centre is doing commendable work under the leadership of Prof. Pamela Singla. Another project of the Department called Centre for Child and Adolescent Well Being (CCAW) will once again start functioning in full swing very shortly. As of now the recruitment process for the social worker is underway and we hope that the Centre would continue to extend its innovative interventions to its diverse clientele groups under the supervision of Prof. Sushma Batra.

The Department continued to run the prestigious projects: Community Development Cell and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan for the University of Delhi. The projects are being undertaken in five villages which have been adopted by the University, and which have been identified on the basis of their low socio-economic indicators. These are: Badarpur Khadar, Chauhan Patti, Jagatpur, Mukundpur and Jharoda. The ten students placed there for their concurrent field work, together with their faculty supervisors worked hard to undertake new initiatives including sessions with pregnant women and

ANMs; strengthening of the ICDS programme; networking with NGOs for skill development programmes; organisation of health camps; infrastructure development and many more need based participatory interventions. The University is immensely proud of the role that the Department is playing in sustaining the programmes without any financial resources. The team of Prof. Manoj Kumar Jha as Chairperson and me as Member Secretary continued to provide leadership to these flagship programmes.

In terms of our endeavour to continuously engage with the issues and challenges emergent in a dynamic and ever evolving society, the Department organised a series of academic workshops, seminars, discussions and training programmes. The many new initiatives included a ten days *Workshop on Research Methodology in Quantitative Research and SPSS* for PhD. scholars in Social Sciences; a two-day *National Seminar on Empowering Elderly in Vulnerable Constituencies: Role of State and Civil Society*; a Seminar titled *Social Justice in Neoliberal Times: Issues and Concerns*, a Seminar on *Improving Development Effectiveness through Impact Evaluation and Evidence Synthesis*; a Seminar on *Migrant Workers: Rights and Concerns* and a Seminar on *Beyond Prison Walls - Conversation on Prisoners' Rights*. The Department also organised the *Dr. S. Selvam Memorial Debate* and the *Third Ambedkar Memorial Lecture*. It also spearheaded a very innovative five-day *National Art Workshop* at the Tihar Jail premises; an unprecedented and immensely worthwhile *Tihar Residential Camp* for students; an impactful *Women's Leadership Summit*; and a month long *Induction Training for Capacity Support Officers (CSOs) and Social Workers*. We also celebrated the International Women's Day with great fervour and rigour and organised two very meaningful and participatory programmes on sexual and gender based violence in collaboration with Care, Pahal and Doctors without Borders. In addition, the Department also initiated a *Lecture Series on Mental Health* with the aim to develop a positive sense of emotional and spiritual well-being among the students. We also started unique events in the form of *Celebration of North East Day* and also organised an exclusive *Job Fair for Persons with Disability* in the Department. Both these programmes brought a galaxy of resource persons and collaborating organisations to participate in the achievement of stipulated outcomes of these programmes.

I am honoured to share that the Department has become a proud member of the prestigious Asian Pacific Association for Social Work Education (APASWE). We have also strengthened our association with the University of Calgary, University of Edinburgh, University of South Australia and the Campbell Collaboration, to name a few. The Department also enriched its pedagogy to include *Theatre and Music as expressions of Social Work Values*. This was reinforced through events such as Youthra 2: A street theatre competition; staging of plays like Dario Fo & Franca Rame's 'A Woman Alone', 'Akkarmashi', 'Ain' and a musical programme called *Secular Traditions in Hindustani Music and Poetry: A Musical Journey from 13<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> Century*, which were held at the Department.

As the Head of this very dynamic institution, I wish to highlight that all of us at the Department are constantly striving to work hard to augment the knowledge, competencies, value base and the overall persona of our students, whom we consider as the backbone of our Department. I take this opportunity to heartily complement our students, who have continued to do us proud, not only through their academic achievements and co-curricular engagement, but also through their association with diverse contemporary issues and concerns.

The Students' Union and the Hostel Club of our Department are student bodies that play an active and important role in the corporate life of the Department. Special thanks are due to Mr. Ajit Kumar, President, Students' Union, and Mr. Shantanu Singh Tanwar, General Secretary, as also to Mr. Abhijeet Kumar, and Mr. Krishan Kumar Singh, who are the President and Vice President of the Hostel Club respectively. They, together with the other members deserve special appreciation for their participation and enthusiasm. Special commendation is also due to the entire student body for the active role that they continued to play in the corporate life of the Department. The Student Union organised many programmes including the Winter Carnival and also assisted in the Inter College Dr. S. Selvam Memorial Debate Competition.

During this year our students took multiple initiatives and contributed immensely toward the professional growth of the Department. The initiation and active

contribution of the unofficial blog of the Department named *Bebak Batkahi* (that essentially means ‘unabashed conversation’) was indeed a very significant and proud development for the Department. With the intent to facilitate free expression and showcase latent talent on a common digital platform, this initiative has sparked of a series of innovative engagements. Yet another excellent edition of Milestones, the Departmental Magazine was created with the participation of students and scholars. A Photography Exhibition displaying some of the most interesting and creative photographs captured by the members of the Photography Club was also organised by the students. The Film and Theatre Society and Prof. Shankar Pathak Society for Environmental Action have been working towards forging student participation in developmental and sustainability issues and concerns. Indeed, the Department has grown stronger through the committed engagements of so many student groups.

I feel proud to say that apart from shouldering their teaching responsibility very satisfactorily at the Department, our faculty members are undertaking research work on multiple themes, as also sharing their academic and professional expertise with many organisations. They are also making valuable contribution to the furtherance of developmental action in different parts of the country. They continue to be engaged in a number of research projects being undertaken with financial support from the government Departments, corporate and international organisations. Over this year too our faculty contributed books and published research papers in international as well as national journals of high repute. They presented papers; chaired and moderated diverse sessions; and attended many seminars, conferences and workshops. They represented the Department on many reputed University Committees and bodies, as also on many core committees of the government and non- government entities. Our alumni continued to excel and contribute in diverse arenas all over the country and the world. They constitute our ambassadors to the outside world and reflect the glory of this Department in their chosen domains of work. Let me take this opportunity to express our deep gratitude to all our alumni and say that we are indeed proud of their many distinctions and accomplishments.

I shall be failing in my duty if I do not appreciate the contribution of the non teaching staff. Their silent and persevering efforts enable us to achieve all that we do. So I take

this opportunity to thank all of them for their cooperation and tireless service rendered to the Department with full conviction and commitment. Mrs. Neelam Malhotra, Section Officer Accounts, retired during this year and I wish to thank her for her selfless service to the Department.

As I complete my first year of headship, I realise more and more that it takes the participation and support of the full team to forge ahead. I wish to express my sincere gratitude to all my colleagues in the faculty, the administrative and all non-teaching staff and my dearly cherished students for their active participation in the smooth functioning of the Department and in making this Annual Day a success. Sincere gratitude is also extended to all field work agencies, and all placement organisations which have offered employment to our students. I also express my heartfelt thanks to one and all, who partnered with us in our academic and field action activities during the year.

Before I end my address, I wish to offer prayers to the memory of our dearest and most revered Prof. Shankar. H. Pathak, who we lost in December 2017. Needless to say, in him we lost one of our founding pillars and the most renowned social work educators. He was an integral part of this Department for many years and shall be deeply missed by the faculty, students and alumni, as also by the profession at large. We also deeply mourn the loss of dear Surenderji and Baldevji, two of our exemplar non teaching retired staff last year. Those of us who had the good fortune of working with them know the immense contribution they made to this Department through their committed and persevering efforts. We pray for them and for their families.

## II. ACADEMIC COURSES

The Department of Social Work is a pioneering institute in Social Work Education imparting professional training since 1946. The Department offers education at three levels namely PhD, M. Phil and M.A. in Social Work.

### *A. Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) Programme*

The Department presently has fifty nine scholars registered under different supervisors for their Doctoral Research. Of these, thirteen scholars took admission in July, 2017. Like every year, a written test was conducted in July, 2017 as part of the admissions process for the PhD Programme. All applicants, except those who are holders of JRF or any national level fellowship are required to qualify this test before proceeding to the second stage of admission, which entails presentation of research proposals before the Department Research Committee (DRC).

During this period, four PhD scholars submitted their thesis. They are Mr. Ravi Ranjan, Mr. H. Arokiaraj, Ms. Gyanwati and Ms. Bhawana Malik. Ms. Mali Devi has been awarded PhD degree during this period. Prof. Sanjai Bhatt continues to act as DRC Coordinator.

### ***C. Admissions under M. Phil. Programme, 2017-2019***

The admission process for M. Phil Programme 2017-2019 was completed by the second week of August, 2017 and the academic programme began from 5<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. Fourteen candidates were selected after a written test and interview. Of these, eleven candidates took admission in M. Phil Programme and are presently pursuing M. Phil Part I. The following electives were offered this year:

1. Health and Social Work
2. Human Relations and Employees Welfare
3. Social Work with Families
4. Women Welfare and Development

### ***D. Master of Arts (Social Work) Programme***

#### ***1. Admissions***

Continuing with the online centralised admission process initiated by the University of Delhi in 2014, the admissions for 2017 followed the same pattern. The Admission Convener for 2017 was Dr. Neena Pandey and she was assisted by a Committee comprising the faculty members of the Department.

Counselling was provided to the applicants to guide them and address their queries and concerns related to the admission procedure, entrance examination and course content. The counselling continued over a period of month and was provided by the faculty members. Applicants sought guidance on preparation for the entrance examination, cut- off marks, eligibility concerns, course content and scope of this course.

The total number of seats for the M.A. programme is 85 (excluding supernumerary seats). The Department of Social Work offers reservations to the candidates belonging to SC, ST and OBC categories as per the Government of India directives. The Department received a total of 1856 applications for the Masters Programme in 2017. Of these, 227 applicants belonged to SC category, 132 were from ST category, 356

were from OBC category, 27 were from PwD category, 20 were from CW category and 1094 were from the unreserved category.

An entrance test was conducted on 5<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 which was the first stage of the screening of the candidates, wherein 1392 out of the 1856 applicants appeared for the test. Of these, 434 candidates were shortlisted for personal interview and finally admissions were offered to 128 candidates from different categories. 95 candidates took admission. The category-wise break-up of the admitted students is as follows: 44 (UR); 23 (OBC); 13 (SC); 6 (ST); 4 (PwD); 3 (CW). The gender wise distribution of the admitted students is 40 females and 55 males. Two foreign students also sought admission in the M.A. Programme in 2017, which took the total admissions in M.A. first semester to 97. The admitted batch comprises graduates from Sociology, Social Work, English, Political Science, Economics, Home Science, Geography, Engineering, Management, Media and Journalism Studies and also Basic Sciences to name a few.

## ***2. Field Work Programme and Components***

Field work is an integral part of Social Work curriculum which provides students of social work hands on learning experience. It gives them an opportunity to develop a comprehensive understanding of the situations and problems, their causative factors and possible strategies of intervention. Field work at the Department encompasses a range of activities which help the students to imbibe and integrate knowledge, skills, competencies and core values of social work. This enables them to evolve as skilled and proficient social work professionals. Clearly defined learning objectives for each semester facilitate professional growth. The academic session 2017-18 began under the Directorship of Dr. Sanjoy Roy. The components of fieldwork are discussed below:

### **Orientation Programme**

The Orientation Programme is designed to facilitate an appropriate and meaningful entry of the student learners into the first and second years of the Masters Programme in Social Work. The programme facilitates induction of students to the social work profession by orienting them to its philosophy, methods and areas of intervention, orients the students to the field work programme, its various components, sensitises

the students to the problems of society especially the marginalized and weaker sections.

It is a known fact that the candidates seeking admission to the M.A. Social Work Programme at the Department come from diverse cultural contexts. Attending to this diversity is a crucial aspect of the teaching learning pedagogies of the Department faculty and the same was kept in mind while drafting the orientation programme for 2017 and selecting the resource persons for the sessions. Unfortunately, the Orientation Programme for the first year had to be curtailed owing to the delay in admission process due to the changes introduced by the University.

The planning and the execution of the programme was held under the guidance of the Director, Fieldwork. The core team members for the orientation programme for first semester were Dr. A. Malathi, Mr. P.C. Behera and Mr. Abhishek Thakur. Similarly, the orientation team for the third Semester comprised Dr. Seema Sharma, Dr. Meenu Anand and Mr. N.T. Thomas. Prof. Pamela Singla was the overall In-charge of the orientation programme.

The orientation programme for M.A. Semester I was held for six days from 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 to 07<sup>th</sup> August, 2017; comprising 41 sessions. The programme formulation was a challenging task for the faculty members, as the sessions had to be thoughtfully selected to deal with the time constraint. The aim was to provide a rich learning experience within the short duration of time to usher in the new entrants into the domain of social work. The sessions outlined the profession's nature, attributes, philosophical base, position/status, potential/role and challenges. The students were also acquainted with the social work methods; casework, group work and community practice.

The Orientation Programme for Semester III was held from 20<sup>th</sup> July to 27<sup>th</sup> July, 2017. The programme was ably designed to broaden the learning experience of the students and build upon the core knowledge and skill base that they had acquired over the first two semesters. It comprised 26 technical sessions covering multiple macro and micro aspects related to social work practice. Sessions such as *Grassroots Comics: A Development Communication Tool (Workshop)*, *Knowledge Management*, *Social Enterprise and Technology*, *Contemporary Challenges in Social Work*



*Practice, Remembering Gandhi, Why Media Hides the Critical Social Reality* were thought provoking. The sessions emphasising the fusion of skills and values of social work included *'Academic Writing Skill, Maintaining and Sustaining Personal Relationships, Stress Management, Connecting with People through Theatre and Body Language*. Apart from these sessions, there were four sessions during which sharing of Block Field Work experiences were done. Audio-visual media, active group interactions, journal writing, session feedback and sharing continued as essential components of the orientation programme.

The feedback given by the students of Semester I and III and the reflections in the learning journals suggested that the orientation programme met the objectives of facilitating the students' in understanding of various areas of social work practice, the values and ethics of the profession, the strategies and techniques for effective functioning and issues and challenges confronting different practice spheres.

### **Concurrent Field work**

Social Work is a practice oriented discipline and concurrent field work at the Department of Social Work is a fundamental component of two-year Masters Programme. The aim of this component is to help the students to develop a critical understanding of the social context in which they function, build the required skills and competencies and enhance their capacities for meaningful intervention. The students are placed either in a community setting or in an agency. They are required to work for two field work days in a week in their respective fieldwork settings for the entire academic year. This mode of learning enhances the students' ability to relate theory with practice. It also develops their personal skills in the process of enriching the lives of people with whom the learners work. The concurrent field placements for 2017-18 were made by Mr. P.C. Behera, with the support of Director, Field Work keeping in mind the interests of the students and the requirements of the partnering agencies.

### **Rural Camp**

The Rural Camp space not only provides an exposure to the rural life and issues but the nature of activities also promotes further skill development amongst students. Aiming for holistic professional development, the rural camp provides an

environment to the students to polish their interpersonal skills through the process of group dynamics and team work.

The Rural Camp of 2017 was held at Bikaner District in collaboration with the NGO URMUL from 2<sup>nd</sup> October to 7<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. URMUL largely works on the issues of livelihood, girl's education, SHGs, rural youth capacity building, alternative education options, environmental protection and enhancement, women empowerment and employment generation. The students undertook field visits to four nearby villages. They conducted PRA exercises like seasonal mapping, resources mapping and transect walk. During their short stay, the students were primarily involved in preparation of detailed village/ community profiles, identifying felt as well as actual needs of the villagers, participated in identification of problems and challenges and designing interventions. Focus Group Discussions with the youth and women, rallies, street plays are some of the activities undertaken by the students. The feedback of the students received at the end of the Camp was convincing that it brought the desired learning outcomes.

The Camp was co-ordinated and supervised by four faculty members, Dr. Sanjoy Roy, Prof. Pamela Singla, Mr. P.C. Behera and Dr. Pushpanjali.

### **Student Conference**

Student Conference, as a component of field work programme provides the students a platform to share and discuss their field experiences through research-based academic papers. It gives an opportunity to the students to contextualise their field experiences within a theoretical frame and build upon their analytical skills. With due support of the Director, Field Work, and his team comprising Dr. Archana Kaushik and Ms. Shashi Rani; the students began preparing for the same in October, 2017. The faculty worked with their respective students in planning, writing and presenting their seminar papers. The student conference was held on two days, 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2018. The students also performed the responsibilities of chairing and recording the sessions besides presentation of papers based on their field experiences. The students were divided into five groups along with four faculty members in each group. Intense deliberations and discussions were held within all the groups. The forum also

provided the students with an opportunity to get acquainted with other placement settings and the work being done by their batch mates.

### **Supportive Field Work Instruction**

The component of Supportive Field Work Instruction, as the name suggests, has been instituted to impart supplementary skills and knowledge to the social work trainees. In this academic year, the Field Work Unit organised interactive sessions, inviting eminent social work practitioners and experts from various domains and Departmental faculty to offer an ideal mix of the field realities and theoretical underpinnings. A total of 21 sessions were held during the year, the details of which are provided in the following table.

The sessions were highly productive and evoked an excellent response from the students. They also helped in diversifying the skills repertoire of the students to evolve as competent professionals.

### **Block Placement**

The Block Field Work Training is a mandatory requirement of Master's degree in Social Work. After the second semester examination, the students undergo block fieldwork training for a minimum period of 30 days to a maximum of 45 days. This training starts from May end and goes on till mid-July of the academic year. This component comprises a full time supervised work at a chosen organisation with due

approval of the Department. Block placement is designed to help integrate theory and practice, to enhance the competencies of the students and to garner professional experience. Mr. Sudhir Maske is the Coordinator for block placements for the academic year 2017-18. Like every year, this year also a number of renowned national and international organisations have expressed their keen interest in taking our students as block placement trainees/interns.

### **Campus Placement Cell**

The Placement Cell in the Department acts as a liaison between the students and the recruiting agencies and facilitates the entire placement process. Civil Society Organisations, Public Sector Undertakings, Consulting Companies and many other agencies and institutions working in the developmental sector take part in the campus placement process of the Department.

The Placement Cell is a joint initiative of the students and the Field Work Unit. The Placement Committee comprises the faculty members and student representatives. The interested students of the final year are elected by the class through a fair election process to ensure that sincere and dedicated students are part of the placement committee. The Placement Committee undertakes a number of responsibilities such as organising Pre-Placement Talks, short-listing of the students for jobs based on interest/ job description and facilitating Placement Interviews.

### **Pre-Placement Talks**

The Pre-Placement Talk (PPT) is facilitated by the Placement Committee which helps the recruiting agencies and students to interact with each other. The recruiting agencies share their profile, salary package, work environment and opportunities with the students.

### **Short-listing of Students**

In response to the job descriptions provided by the organisations, interested students apply through the Placement Cell. A detailed resume and sometimes Statement of Purpose (SoP) is submitted by the students as part of the application process. On the

basis of the applications, the agencies are required to send the list of shortlisted candidates to the Placement Committee.

### **Placement Interviews**

The placement process continues over a period of time, beginning in the last week of November. The recruiting agencies can interview the students they have shortlisted on mutually agreed dates. The final placement interview gives the agencies and the students an opportunity to discuss the job roles in detail and make the right choice.

### ***Student Placements till June 2017***

Till the end of June 2017, forty seven of the fifty four interested students from M.A. final had received job offers. Apart from this, the students had made a policy which ensured that a student could not get more than one final job offer. This policy was adhered to during the entire placement process.

### **Placement Organisations**

Till June 2017, thirty four organisations visited the Department for campus recruitment. Of these, thirty two organisations selected students. A total of fifty offers were made. Seventeen organisations called the students for the second round of interview to their respective offices; seventeen organisations held written tests as well as interviews at the campus. Two organisations did not select any candidate from the Department and one organisation wanted the candidate to join them immediately, therefore, the Department had to decline their request.

An average salary package of Rs 4 lac per annum was offered and the highest job offer was for Rs. 6.7 lac per annum. The lowest job offer was for Rs 2 lac per annum. The organisations which have offered the best salaries are KPMG, HANS Foundation, Good Weave, Save the Children, Tata Power-DDL and SOS.

## **V. DEPARTMENT RESOURCES AND AFFILIATES**

### ***A. Centre for Advanced Study (CAS) under UGC***

Recognising Department's contribution towards higher academic research and research excellence, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has acknowledged it as the Centre for Advanced Study (CAS) in Social Work and provided financial support of Rs. 81 lakh for five years in this regard. The financial assistance was provided under the Special Assistance Scheme after completing three terms of support under DSA. However, the financial assistance has not been received for the past three years.

To guide the CAS programme, a CAS Advisory Committee has been constituted with internal and external members. The three external members are Prof. Sreemati Chakrabarti, Dean, Social Sciences as Nominee of Vice Chancellor; Prof. R.R. Singh, Former Director, TISS, Mumbai and Prof. H.Y. Siddqui, Department of Social Work, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad. The five internal members of the committee are Prof. Neera Agnimitra, HOD who is also the Chairperson of the Committee, Prof. Sushma Batra, Prof. Manoj K.Jha, Prof. Pamela Singla, and Prof. Sanjai Bhatt who is the Coordinator and Member Secretary.

The thrust area of CAS is Social Policy and Development with special reference to women, children and poor. Under its proposed work plan, Department with the support of CAS would like to evolve as a Faculty with different and distinct courses strengthening the base of Social Work. It shall strive to produce best quality research in the thrust areas in particular and in the discipline of social work in general.

The four research projects undertaken till date are:

- Gender and Class Analysis of Communal Tension in Delhi: A study of Bawana and Trilokpuri areas of Delhi by Dr. Neena Pandey, Ms. Shashi Rani, Mr. Sudhir Maske and Mr. Iqbal Bhat.

- Convergence of Services and its Impact on Women and Children: A Case Study of a Gender Resource Centre-Samajik Suvidha Kendra by Prof. Neera Agnimitra and Prof. Sanjai Bhatt.
- An Analysis of Stakeholder Perceptions on Elementary Educational Entitlements: A Study in Wazirpur J. J. Colony, Delhi by Dr. Sanjoy Roy and Mr. Pratap C. Behera.
- Sex work as Traditional Occupation: A Study of Children from Bediya Community in Delhi by Dr. Seema Sharma.

In addition, two research papers, one on the issue of homeless in Delhi in relation to the Supreme Court decision and the other based on a study of National Children Fund in the light of changing policies were prepared. The Department library was also enriched under CAS with the addition of new books worth nearly two lakh rupees and with the creation of Kumedan Research Corner on Women and Children in the library in memory of the first Librarian of the Department.

This year, Department has organised a seminar on *"Improving Development Effectiveness through Impact Evaluation and Evidence Synthesis: Evaluations and Evidence Synthesis for Social Programmes"* in joint collaboration with International Initiative for Impact Evaluations (3ie) and Campbell Collaborations. The session was attended by around fifty researchers and research scholars.

### ***B. Library***

The Department has a well established and one of the most reputed libraries amongst the Social Work Institutions. The collection includes books, journals, reports and dissertations. These are referred to by the staff, students and research scholars from the Department as also from the other institutions, with the prior permission of the librarian and the Head. The Library subscribes regularly to eighteen national academic and practice journals including gifted journals. At present, the total collection of resources in the library stands at over 32,285. Users also avail of computers for online access to journals and academic portals through the University of Delhi servers. These are also utilized by the students and researchers for broader

internet access. An additional two computers are available for the library staff for cataloguing and other administrative functions. The Department solicits assistance from various sources, including publishers to ensure that all the publications required by the readers and researchers are procured. We have been able to make notable addition to the library this year and have procured many useful books in the diverse subject domains. The library committee has been very active this year. A participatory approach has been used to involve all the faculty members to recommend the most relevant books in their realms of study/ courses.

### ***C. Delhi School of Social Work Society***

The Delhi School of Social Work Society (DSSWS) aims at the promotion of education, research, training and action in the field of social welfare and development. DSSWS is the mother institution of Delhi School of Social Work, now known as Department of Social Work, University of Delhi. The Society is managed by a member Board of Governors and headed by Prof. R. R. Singh, former Director of Tata institute of Social Sciences as Chairperson. The other office bearers are Prof. Aruna Bhardwaj as Vice President, Prof. Sanjai Bhatt as Secretary and Prof. Sushma Batra as Treasurer. The Society is providing valuable support to the Department in research and consultancy work undertaken by its faculty members. The Society has taken up five research projects and two training programmes in the current year.

The Delhi School of Social Work Society aims to foster a meaningful relationship between academic curriculum and training. It has been networking with 400 NGOs/institutions across the country. Some of these are: NACO, UNIFEM, Media Lab Asia, GAIL, Indraprastha Gas Ltd., Ministry of Woman and Child Development, Government of Jammu & Kashmir, R&D Department, DSACS, NIPCCD, Ministry of Rural Development, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Bureau of Police Research and Development, Mission Convergence, Government of NCT of Delhi, Railway Children, UK, NAPSWI and Tata Power- DDL. It also endeavours to develop a creative instinct, which amalgamates with innovation and initiative producing inventive approaches to address the problems and concerns confronting us.



The society has conducted two training programmes. It has organised a training programme for Family Counsellors/ NGO functionaries of Delhi and Rajasthan with the support of Central Social Welfare Board and Delhi Social Welfare Advisory Board. It has also organised a one day consultation on “Evidence Based Social Work Practice which was led by Dr. Howard White, CEO of Campbell Collaborations and Mr. Denny John, Evidence Synthesis Specialist. DSSW Society action project *Pehchan* entered its twelfth year as an effort for HIV/AIDS prevention in Azadpur area in partnership with Delhi State AIDS Society. The project is working with sex workers and also focuses on counselling. Dr. Akash Gulalia is the Honorary Director of the project. This year, Mr. and Mrs. Widge, alumni of our Department from the 1973-75 batch, have instituted Sahyog Scholarship for the needy students. Delhi School of Social Work Society appreciates and salutes the couple for their positive attitude and cooperative venture. This scholarship awarded on the basis of merit cum need amounting to Rs. 25,000 has benefitted four students.

DSSW Society provides nine awards and four scholarships to the students. It has also initiated an award to recognise the services of the non teaching employees of the Department. Ms. Vandana and Mr. Prabhat Yadav have been selected for this award for their exemplary services.

#### ***D. Department Council***

The Department Council met regularly during the year to deliberate and collectively address the academic, pedagogical, field work and allied administrative issues. During these meetings, the faculty members also shared their academic experiences, contributions, upcoming research and academic opportunities. Mr. N.T Thomas extended his services as the Secretary, Department Council for the year 2017-2018 under the Chairmanship of Prof. Neera Agnimitra, Head of the Department.

#### ***E. Hostel***

The Department has its own hostel. The foundation stone of this hostel was laid by Mrs. Durgabai Deshmukh, Chairman, Central Social Welfare Board, Government of India, New Delhi on 25<sup>th</sup> July, 1962. The hostel became functional from 16<sup>th</sup> July,

1966. Being an attached hostel within the Department premises, it adds to the development of overall personality of the social work students and helps in reinforcing their professional elements. In the current academic session, thirty five women and fifty four men students (totalling 89) are being accommodated in forty five rooms. The occupancy details as on February 2018 are given below.

### **Infrastructure and facilities**

The campus is quite friendly towards persons with disabilities. Its entrance has been modified and fitted with ramps to suit their special needs. There are forty nine rooms; a students' managed Mess with well furnished kitchen and dining facilities; three drinking water points with reverse osmosis filtering facilities; an Air Conditioned common room; two sick/isolation rooms (one in each wing); a meeting room; office rooms; Warden's residence; lush green lawns; groves and gardens; a bore well in addition to municipal water supply; CCTV surveillance in addition to security services; TV with DTH services in the common room; and a number of news papers, magazines and periodicals. DSW Hostel has its own website <http://dswh.du.ac.in> which provides information about the hostel. There is a provision for security in the Department campus throughout the day. For the hostel, there is an additional security during the night time. Two security guards provide their services in two shifts daily. Fire safety measures are also in place.

### **Augmentation in Infrastructure and services**

An inverter has been procured and necessary electric wiring has been carried out as a contingency measure during power failure in addition to the existing one. At present, this facility is being extended to the hostel common room, dining hall, kitchen and a few office rooms. The number of CCTV cameras has increased to twelve. Some perennial plants such as palms, hibiscus and rose have been procured and planted in the hostel premise adding to the existing greenery in the campus.

### **Hostel Club Union**

Hostel Club Union is a democratically elected body of the residents of the Department of Social Work Hostel. This student's body promotes academic/intellectual, cultural and recreational activities amongst the hostel residents. Democratic decision making in essence is followed by monthly general body meetings which include discussions over issues faced by the hostel residents in its functioning. The Hostel Club Union provides a significant platform to the residents to take up initiatives and contribute towards the development of academic environment involving active participation from the residents. It is also instrumental in promoting the demands of the residents to the hostel administration and finding out amicable solutions. The Hostel Club Union held its first general body meeting on September 13, 2017. With the immense support of the hostel staff and participation from the hostel residents, following major initiatives were taken by the Hostel Club Union. It facilitated occasions such as fresher's party to welcome the budding social workers and bidding adieu to the aspiring change makers. With an aim to strengthen camaraderie amongst the residents, the Hostel Club Union celebrated various festivals such as Eid, Diwali, Lohri, Holi, Christmas and alike. It organized a musical night on the occasion of Lohri. The Club Union in association with Chetanalaya organized an event 'SAMARTHAYA', on November 23, 2017 in the hostel premises to support a nationwide awareness programme on the disability rights. It also took initiatives to hold discussions/post dinner talks in the hostel on the contemporary issues. The Hostel Union in association with Ambedkar Memorial Lecture Committee observed Mahaparinirvan Diwas to Commemorate Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar. It also organized special dinner to invite the day scholars, faculties from different Departments and a few foreign nationals for facilitating their integration with the hostel residents. The Hostel

Union in collaboration with Prof. Shankar Pathak Society for Environmental Action conducted a waste audit in the hostel and helped in planning and development of a compost pit. To celebrate cultural diversity and promote individual talent, Hostel Club Union organized hostel night on March 12, 2018. The occasion was graced by the provost and the warden along with the hostel staff.

In the current session, the fresher's welcome party was held in the hostel on the 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. The occasion was graced by the provost and the warden.

#### ***F. Students' Union***

The Students' Union of the Department of Social Work is a democratically elected student body with active participation in all the academic and co-curricular activities of the Department. The Union provides a platform for the students to take up initiatives to contribute to the academic and extra-curricular life of the Department. The office bearers of the Union act as a communication bridge between the students and the academic and administrative staff for effective functioning of the Department. The present Students Union, under the leadership of Mr. Ajit Kumar, President and Mr. Shantanu Singh Gaur, General Secretary along with the active support of other Union members, students, faculty members and non-teaching staff took a number of initiatives. Activities of the Department of Social Work Students Union during the current year are as follows:

- The Union assisted the Department in conducting a debate on “*Professionalization of Sanitation Workers will Lead to Elimination of Manual Scavenging and the Stigmas Attached to It*” on the occasion of Dr. S. Selvam Memorial Debate. Mr. Bezwada Wilson was the chief guest and judge for the event that was held on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. Students from various Universities came forward to participate in this debate.
- The Union in collaboration with Street Level Awareness Programme (SLAP), a Delhi-based NGO working towards prevention of Gender-Based Violence, organised a Seminar on *Women's Safety and Empowerment* on 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. There was a discussion on Gender Based Violence and demonstration of

self-defence tactics. This was followed by a legal awareness talk and a guideline for managing one's finances.

- The Union worked to improve the Website of the Department to enhance access to information related to the Department.
- The Union assisted the Department to host a Theatre Performance titled “*A Woman Alone*” in association with Sukhmanch Theatre and Shilpi Marwaha and written by Dario FO and Franca Rame on 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2017.
- As the Chairperson of the Placement Committee, the Union President along with the Committee members facilitated the work of Placement Cell.
- On the occasion of Mahaparinirvan Diwas, the Union facilitated a Candlelight Tribute ceremony to Dr. Baba Sahib Bhim Rao Ambedkar on his 61<sup>st</sup> death anniversary on 8<sup>th</sup> December, 2017.
- The Union organised a Winter Carnival on 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 to welcome the new batch of students. The carnival included activities such as dance, games and refreshments for the students. Each student was also presented with a title and a token of friendship on behalf of the seniors. The programme gave an opportunity to break ice between the II<sup>nd</sup> semester and IV<sup>th</sup> semester students.

## **VI. DEPARTMENT'S EXTENSION PROJECTS**

### ***A. Centre for Child and Adolescent Well Being***

The Centre for Child and Adolescent wellbeing is one of the demonstration projects of the Department. Earlier known as Child Guidance Centre, its main aim is to provide diagnostic treatment and referral services to the emotionally disturbed and socially deprived children, adolescents and to their families.

During the year under report, the centre could not undertake any activity as funds for the post of social worker (which had been existing for more than three decades) were not released by the University. The activities being undertaken by the centre in the past had proved highly beneficial to the children and adolescents studying in the neighbourhood schools and residing in the nearby slum areas. However, with the constant efforts of the Head of the Department, the permission to fill the post of social worker has recently been received. The process of recruiting social worker is already in progress and we hope that this year the centre will be able to function in full swing and begin with organising the summer camp which has been one of the most popular activities as it includes children of the employees of all cadres of the University.

### ***B. Centre for Community Development and Action***

The Centre for Community Development and Action (CCDA), earlier known as Gram Mahila Kendra is an extension and demonstration unit of the Department. The Centre which started in 1957 in Alipur, Samaipur block, initiated its activities in the village Burari in the year 1988, with a focus on universal elementary and non-formal education, health and skill training programmes. Over the years, the Unit has shifted its base to cover various areas in Burari spreading over Swaroop Nagar, Shakarpura, Satya Vihar, Nathupura, Burari Garhi and Ajit Vihar to name a few. As per the available records, some of the programmes initiated under the Centre have ranged from Self Help Groups, health programmes, vocational training, programme for the elderly, legal aid programme, non formal education (NFE), nutritional awareness programme and the balwadi programme. Presently, the Centre is working in Ajit Vihar, Burari with focus on children, adolescents and women's well being with a participatory approach.

Prof. Pamela Singla is the Director (Honorary) of the Centre. The Social Worker attached to the Centre left in the month of August, 2017 to pursue further studies and the Department is in the process of recruiting a new social worker at the Centre. Two students from the Department are placed at the Centre as part of their field work. The Centre celebrated the International Women's Day and the International Yoga Day on 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2017 and 21<sup>st</sup> June, 2017 respectively with very good participation from the community and it would be continuing with the practice in future too.

### ***C. Community Development Cell, University of Delhi***

The work in the five villages adopted under the Community Development Cell programme moved to its third year with a new team of ten students being placed there for concurrent field work. Villages having low socio-economic indicators namely Badarpur Khadar, Chauhan Patti, Jagatpur, Mukundpur and Jharoda were chosen for community development initiatives. Based on the need assessment done by the students the interventions have begun. A brief about the interventions in the villages is given below.

**Badarpur Khadar** Village is one of the remotest villages in Delhi bordering UP. The village lacks basic amenities and social infrastructure. It had no transport connectivity. With the intervention of the students and follow up with the Regional Transport Authorities, the village is now provided with a bus service. The village does not have a health centre or a Mohalla Clinic. This issue was taken up by the trainee students with the concerned authorities and the village has now been provided with a mobile health van and the possibility of establishing a health centre is being negotiated with the authorities. The trainee students successfully organised a health camp in the community and worked on the issue of school drop-outs thus facilitating the enrolment of children in the school. They also facilitated the community residents in the opening of bank accounts and helped in financial inclusion. The trainee students facilitated in redressing the livelihood concerns of the youth by promoting self-employment opportunities, forming youth groups in the community and conducting awareness programmes. They also ensured social security benefits under different schemes of the Government by identifying the eligible beneficiaries and linking them with the concerned Department to avail of the benefits.

**Chauhan Patti** is located on the outskirts of Delhi. It has witnessed neglect by successive Governments and flounders to of avail the benefit of various developmental initiatives and programmes of the Government. The community has internal cast and class differences. The interventions were thus made for greater cohesion of the community and to address the developmental issues. The students placed in the community worked on the issue of school drop outs, improving the enrolment in schools, holding regular sessions with children and parents to offer counselling and strengthening of preschool education under ICDS. The trainee students successfully organized Health Camps in the community and made efforts to address the livelihood concerns of the community. They facilitated interactions of the community youth with various NGOs working in the field of skill development and organized soft skill training for the youth groups as also craft training and mehendi training for self-employment. The trainee students promoted organic-cropping in the community and held sessions with the farmers to disseminate information about the harmful effects of fertilizers. The trainee students also worked closely with the elected representatives of the Urban Local Bodies to bridge the development gap.

**Jagatpur** village is located in the North Delhi District. It comes under Burari Vidhan Sabha Constituency. It lies at a distance of 4 Km from District Head Quarters in Sadar Bazar. The students placed in Jagatpur are also working on improving the functioning of ICDS programme. The trainee students have been involved in the capacity building of Anganwadi workers and helpers.

Taking cognizance of the health issues affecting the residents, the trainee students organised a number of medical camps and awareness generation sessions by networking with various organisations. They were also involved in activities aimed at generating awareness amongst the children on a plethora of subjects at schools and in the community.

A health camp was conducted in August, 2017 and eighty seven residents benefitted from it. A Mehendi camp was also organised which benefitted more than thirty young girls. The students placed there are continuously working with group of young women and men, creating awareness about various concerns of the community and also on their own personal growth.

**Jharoda** village is located in the North Delhi District. The village is divided into eight different parts. The trainee students have identified the lack of availability of



safe drinking water, sanitation, school dropout and health as the major areas of concern in this village. Women in the community have often expressed their desire to work from home if some opportunities are available to them. A mehendi Camp was organised and more than forty seven young women benefitted from it. A health Camp was also conducted where more than seventy seven residents of the community benefitted and a few were referred to specialist for free check up.

The trainee students have also been working regularly with the groups to address the problems of adolescents and school dropouts. Strengthening of existing groups and formation of new groups in the villages is being done to garner the support of different sections of the village for implementation of further activities. Networking with Non- Governmental Organisations in the area is being done to mobilise people to avail of the services being rendered in the community and initiatives have also been taken to bring some organisations from outside to deliver need based services. The trainee students have also been involved in strengthening the ICDS programme. They are involved in transforming the Anganwadi centres from being food distribution centre to resource centres which focus on psychological, physical and social development of the child. They have initiated engaging activities with the children at the centres.

**Mukundpur** is situated on the border of Delhi and Haryana, opposite to the resettlement colony of Jahangirpuri. Mukundpur is the most thickly populated of all the communities covered under the programme. In Mukundpur, the trainee students have mainly focused on health sector. They have taken sessions with pregnant women and ANMs working with these pregnant women. They have been working to encourage institution based deliveries and ensuring proper pre-natal and ante-natal care during pregnancy and after the birth of the child. The trainee students are closely working with the dispensary, doctors and other staff members to bring in the real stake holders into the process. The trainee students have also created a platform where they have brought together mothers and adolescent girls to discuss menstrual health and hygiene issues.

As health is a major concern, a medical camp was organised for the benefit of the residents of the community where ninety six people benefitted from it. Mehendi camp was also organised and more than fifty five young girls benefitted from it.

## **VII. DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES**

A number of academic initiatives were undertaken and many activities were organised during the year. A glimpse of these initiatives and activities is given below.

### ***A. Programmes and Seminars***

#### ***i. Women's Leadership Summit***

The Women's Leadership Summit was held on 8<sup>th</sup> April, 2017, at the Department with an aim to bring together those who are working for the women empowerment through social activities, academic interventions, government machinery and field action. It discussed various aspects of women empowerment as well as provisions and schemes for realising this goal. It also discussed the obstacles and practical difficulties faced by the individuals and NGOs working for the empowerment of women and explored solutions to overcome such hindrances. The summit provided a platform for consultation amongst NGOs, academicians and women leaders to share their experiences, build networks and outline the issues faced by the individuals and organisations working for women empowerment and explore the solutions to overcome such hindrances. The summit was jointly organised by Department and Women's Manifesto and was sponsored by Human Welfare Foundation. Ms. Swati Maliwal, Chairperson, Delhi Commission for Women inaugurated the summit. Ms. Shabnam Hashmi was the guest of honour. Dr. Sharnas Muthu, General Secretary, Women's Manifesto; gave an introduction to the summit. Prof. Neera Agnimitra, Head, Department of Social Work gave the Presidential Address. The summit also had paper presentations and paper sharing by different organisations. Dr. Neena Pandey facilitated the summit.

#### ***ii. Seminar on Social Justice in Neoliberal Times: Issues and Concerns***

A two days national seminar on the theme, "Social Justice in Neoliberal Times: Issues and Concerns" was organised in the Department on 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of April, 2017 under the convenership of Ms. Shashi Rani. The seminar was sponsored by ICSSR and University of Delhi. The aim of the seminar was to create a body of knowledge at the

interface of various theoretical and functional areas of social justice, social and economic development and empowerment and to provide a forum for bringing out an intellectual discourse on social reality of the marginalized sections of the society. The seminar aimed for an engaged view of state welfare policies through discussions and deliberations. As special guest, Shri D. Raja presented his perspective on the theme of the seminar. Prof. Gopal Guru from Centre for political Science, SSS, JNU delivered the keynote address at the inaugural ceremony of the seminar. Prof. Vivek Kumar, CSSS/SSS, JNU extended the Valedictory address at the end of the Seminar. There were subject experts and speakers for the panel discussion in this seminar. The seminar also created a platform for researchers and students from different institutions to share their work/ideas in context of the seminar theme through paper presentations and poster presentations.

### ***iii. Residential Camp at Tihar Prison***

The Department organized a Residential Camp for four days from 21<sup>st</sup> May, 2017 to 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2017 at Tihar Prison to provide the students with a hands on experience of working in a correctional setting. The camp aimed at imparting soft skills training to the Jail staff and especially jail warders so that they can conduct themselves better with both inmates and the outsiders who come in the Jail as (non-police) voluntary or paid staff. It also focused on conducting a need assessment of the inmates and identifying their individual, social, psychological and collective needs in the prison, critically analyzing the infrastructure of the Jail setting with special focus on sanitation and hygiene in the Jail, understanding the life of inmates in the context of criminal justice system and the problems they face within the legal system and jail and identifying the vulnerable and excluded groups in the Jail. It aimed to propose ideas for their reformation and inclusion with other inmates. This camp provided an opportunity to the students to also get over their biases besides focussing on the objectives of the camp. The camp was organised with the support of Tihar prison administration by Dr. Neena Pandey. Prof. Pamela Singla, Dr. Shashi Rani Dev and Dr. Mali Sawariya from Aditi Mahavidyalaya were the faculty members who facilitated the camp.

***iv. Workshop on Research Methodology in Quantitative Research and SPSS for PhD scholars in Social Sciences***

A ten days workshop on 'Research Methodology in Quantitative Research and SPSS for PhD scholars in Social Sciences' was organised by the Department under the guidance of Prof. Sushma Batra as its Course Director. It was held at the Department from 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2017 to 7<sup>th</sup> June, 2017. The financial support to the workshop was provided by Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi. The workshop was attended by thirty five participants from six states. The participants of the workshop were the research scholars registered for PhD with various Universities. The workshop was aimed to enhance the basic methodological skills of the participants to undertake an empirical social science research; address common errors and frequently asked questions by the research scholars; provide practical expertise for developing research questions, tools, data analysis and writing report; introduce them to web-based resources and provide a cross-learning experience; and enable them to use Statistical Packages for Social Sciences (SPSS). The workshop covered topics starting from selection of the problem to methods of data collection, sampling techniques and data analysis with the help of SPSS Software. The entire course was taught with the help of audiovisual aids by experienced resource persons drawn from Delhi, Rajasthan and Gujarat.

***v. International Yoga Day (IYD) Celebrations***

The International Yoga Day (IYD) was celebrated on 21<sup>st</sup> June, 2017 at the Centre for Community Development and Action with full vigour and enthusiasm. The social worker Ms. Dimple Mishra conducted full day yoga sessions with the support of the Director Prof. Pamela Singla and Head of the Department Prof. Neera Agnimitra. The sessions were conducted in three batches and for three different groups of participants namely-Balwadi and community children, adolescent girls and mothers of the Balwadi children. The three groups are the members of CCDA for its ongoing programmes. The camp was conducted with the objective to spread awareness on the benefits of yoga among the community members, bring them together and promote mental and physical health of the community people through yoga practice. The sessions included both the practice of yoga and the theory by sharing benefits of yoga

with the respective groups. Care was taken to explain the *asanas* and benefits in simple language which the participants could understand. Sessions were conducted keeping in mind the requirement of the different age groups. The community members benefitted from the programme and participated enthusiastically in the celebrations.

***vi. Tihar Kalabhiyan 2017***

A five-day National Art Workshop was held inside the Tihar Jail premises from 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2017 in which around eighty prisoners from Tihar and other Indian jails were trained in painting and sculpture by fourteen famous artists associated with Lalit Kala Akademi. The prisoners created over 300 artworks during this workshop. Other than this, they also showcased their other talents like dance, singing and acting to the public through the cultural evenings organised at Dilli Haats of Pitampura, I.N.A. and Janakpuri from 20<sup>th</sup> August to 22<sup>nd</sup> August, 2017. The Department facilitated the management of these events. An exhibition was organised at Lalit Kala Akademi where the students of Social Work coordinated the programme. Dr. Neena Pandey coordinated the programme on behalf of the Department of Social Work. The Director General (Prisons) of Tihar appreciated the efforts of the students of the Department for the efficient management of the event. On 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2017, Hon'ble Culture & Tourism Minister, Govt. of India, Dr. Mahesh Sharma inaugurated 'Tihar School of Art' and an art gallery at Tihar Jail no. 4, where along with the paintings made by the prisoners; the Lalit Kala Akademi, from its permanent collection, exhibited digital reproductions of artworks made by renowned Master artists.

***vii. Lecture Series on Mental Health***

Recognising the need to develop a positive sense of emotional and spiritual well-being among the students, Department initiated a Lecture Series on 'Mental Health and Well-Being'. The aim of the series was to make the students realize their abilities, cope with the normal stressors of life and work productively in a pro social environment. Presented below are the details of lectures held in the Department during the year 2017-18. The lectures were coordinated by Dr. Meenu Anand.

***viii. Induction Training for Capacity Support Officers (CSOs) and Social Workers***

A training for the Capacity Support Officers (CSOs) and fifty three social workers hired for the 'Social Service Units' Project (SSU Project) was conducted by Delhi Police in collaboration with the Department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia and Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai. The training was conducted in two batches. The second batch was trained at the Department from 25<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 to 30<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. Dr. Neena Pandey was the coordinator for this induction training. This SSU pilot project of the home ministry funded by the "Nirbhaya fund" covered the following objectives. It aimed to inculcate knowledge amongst SWs/CSOs on various concepts like women's movement in India, violence against women, sex, gender and sexuality, patriarchy-framework for practice; to develop an understanding of the social workers' role in Social Service Units in favour of the survivors through supporting of the police system; to help develop a pro-woman/feminist approach/lenses/which would guide them while dealing with the cases of violence against women; introduce the social workers to feminist/ pro-woman counseling techniques; equip the social workers with the knowledge of laws and legislations related to crimes against Women and Children; develop counseling skills in a professional manner; enhance skills to increase networking and linkages to

use in crisis management and develop knowledge on police hierarchy, safety planning and suicide prevention.

***ix. Seminar on Beyond Prison Walls - Conversation on Prisoners' Rights***

Department in collaboration with Tihar Prisons, Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D) and Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative (CHRI) organised a one-day seminar on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2017 at NDMC Convention Centre, New Delhi to discuss issues concerning the prison system and prisoners' rights. The event 'Beyond Prison Walls - Conversation on Prisoners' Rights' was envisioned as a space to build relationships at the intersection of criminal justice; between people behind bars and those who govern the system. The chief guests of the seminar were Honourable (Dr.) Justice B.S. Chauhan, Chairman, Law Commission of India, Honourable Justice Madan B. Lokur of Supreme Court of India and Mr. Manish Sisodia, Deputy Chief Minister of Delhi. The seminar had representation from the various agencies of the criminal justice system, including judicial officers, lawyers, prosecutors, government and police officials, media and legal aid functionaries and in a one of its kind initiative also gave voices to prisoners in Tihar who shared their stories during the seminar and also performed two small plays; one by women prisoners and one by men prisoners. Dr. Neena Pandey coordinated the event as Master of Ceremonies.

***x. Dr. S. Selvam Memorial Debate***

Dr. S. Selvam Memorial Debate was held on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2017 in memory of Late Dr. Selvam. The debate was organised in collaboration with Action Aid. The topic of the debate was "*Professionalization of Sanitation Workers will Lead to Elimination of Manual Scavenging and the Stigma Attached to It*". The competition that was open to all the students across various Universities in Delhi NCR generated widespread interest. 136 students registered for participation out of which thirty were shortlisted. The three winners are now ambassadors of Action Aid. Mr. Bezwada Wilson was the Chief Guest and member of the jury for the debate.

***xi. One day Workshop on Self Defence***

One day workshop on *Self Defence* was organised by the Department in collaboration with Delhi Police (North) on 6<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. The purpose of the training workshop was to orient the students towards the techniques and skills of self defence,

importance of mental alertness and confidence to deal with awkward situations in personal and public life and how to respond in crisis/ crime situations. The programme aimed to create gender equality in the context of response towards crime incidents/situations. The programme was coordinated by Ms. Shashi Rani.

***xii. Job Fair for Persons with Disability***

An exclusive job fair was organized by the Department in association with Samarthanam Trust for Persons with Disability on the 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 at the Department of Social Work. Eleven organisations and 240 candidates with disability took advantage of this job fair. The organisations which participated were Accenture, AEGIS, Awake Soul Pharmaceuticals, Dell, Infosys, Jakson, Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC), Nabe India, National Organisation for Social Empowerment, Vodafone (Aman Enterprises) and Wipro. The Job Fair was inaugurated by the Head of the Department; Prof. Neera Agnimitra This was followed by the Director of Samarthanam Trust addressing the audience. Participants of the fair included persons with visual, orthopaedic and hearing challenges. The job fair served as an ideal opportunity to bring differently able candidates from all over the city and prospective employers together, on one platform. It also gave the students of the Department of Social Work an excellent exposure to the field of disability. A few organisations gave final offers to the selected candidates while others collected the details of the applicants for future requirements. The fair was coordinated by Mr. Abhishek Thakur.

***xiii. Talk on Contemporary Development in Indian Democracy by Shri Varun Gandhi***

The Department of Social Work, University of Delhi in collaboration with the Comparative Federalist Research Group, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi and Shyam Lal College (Evening) organised a two hours long academic lecture by Hon'ble Shree Varun Gandhi on the theme *Contemporary Development in Indian Democracy* on 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2018.

***xiv. Bicycle Rally Closing Event***

Department of Social Work, University of Delhi organised a Bicycle Rally Closing Event in collaboration with World Vision India, Delhi office on 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2018.



The Bicycle Rally was a small campaign with an aim to spread the message of *Swachha Bharat Abhiyan*. Twenty students and two faculty members from Bhopal School of Social Sciences (BSSS) participated in this rally covering a distance of 1000 Km from Bhopal to Delhi. They had begun their journey on 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2018, from Bhopal through different villages across five states to spread the message of clean India campaign through street play and songs. The rally-closing event was organised at the Department. In this event, the World Vision presented their work and the background of this bicycle rally. Mr. Sudhir Maske, was the event coordinator. In this event, World Vision also honoured the Safai Karamcharis of the Department.

***xv. Seminar on Improving Development Effectiveness through Impact Evaluation and Evidence Synthesis***

A one day seminar was organised by the Department of Social Work and the International Initiative for Impact Evaluation (3ie) on 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 as part of the 3ie Delhi Seminar series. The seminar was coordinated by Prof. Sanjai Bhatt. The objective of the seminar was to acquaint research scholars with impact evaluation, evidence based research and evidence synthesis for social programmes. The seminar provided an overview of impact evaluation and evidence synthesis with examples and experiences from the field. It also focused on informing the participants on how to improve existing frameworks, tools and techniques for assessing program outcomes and policies in the development sector. The resource persons for the seminar were Dr. Francis Rathinam, Senior Evaluation Specialist at 3ie and Dr. Denny John, Evidence Synthesis Specialist at Campbell Collaboration. Dr. Rathinam highlighted the basics of conducting assessment studies that focus on gaining knowledge about ‘what works’ in the development programmes. Dr. John focussed on the use of evidence in designing and planning interventions in the social sector. The seminar also provided a platform for the research scholars to interact with the experts and gain clarity on developing high quality methodology for research.

***xvi. Two days Training program of Child Care Institution (CCI) functionaries on Individual Care Plan and Gender Sensitivity***

This program was jointly organised by Delhi Child Protection Unit –V, A.V. Baliga Trust and Department of Social Work on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> of February, 2018, at the

University of Delhi Guest House. The training programme was coordinated by Ms. Shashi Rani. The training was aimed at orienting and enhancing the knowledge of the functionaries of CCIs on individual care plan; orienting the functionaries on how to prepare individual care plan in the best interest of the child; creating awareness on the issue of adolescent girls' safety and their inclusion in the cities; and building capacities of different stakeholders to promote actions in favour of the girls safety by improving understanding on legal framework, programme, policies, law and initiatives and creating awareness on Juvenile Justice Care and Protection Act, 2015 and Juvenile Model Goal, 2016.

***xvii. Seminar on Migrant Workers: Rights and Concerns***

A one day seminar on the Migrant Workers: Rights and Concerns was held in the Department on 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2018 in collaboration with Sadbhav Mission. The seminar focused on Trans-nation and Trans-state migration; issues of human rights and gender; rights of the migrants and challenges faced by them. The seminar focussed on the factors responsible for migration, legal status, population levels and job profiles of the migrant workers, impact of migration on the local people, fundamental rights of the migrants and national concerns. The seminar was coordinated by Mr. Pratap C. Behera.

***xviii. Celebration of North East Day***

The Department celebrated the North East Day on 10<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 for the first time. This event saw a wholehearted participation with at least 200 participants from outside. The programme included a panel discussion, a cultural show and a story-telling session. The Chief Guest was Mr. David Lalringsanga, IPS, Joint Commissioner of Police and Nodal Officer for North East People. The Panel discussion was moderated by Dr. Kongbrailatpam Ratnabali, Assistant Professor, Faculty of Law and Dy. Dean Legal Affairs, University of Delhi. The Panellists included Dr. Swargajyoti Gohain, Assistant Professor, Ashoka University, Sonapat, Dr. Veio Pou, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi, Dr. Avitoli Zhimo, Assistant Professor, Department of Anthropology, University of Delhi and Ms. Sentisungla Longchar, Assistant

Professor, Department of Psychology, Lady Shri Ram College, University of Delhi. The Cultural programme reflected the rich diversity of North East with enthralling dances and soulful songs. The day also saw food stalls displaying food items from the states of Meghalaya, Manipur, Nagaland, Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh. A variety of mouth-watering delicacies were a huge crowd puller. The celebration of North East day underscores the need to celebrate the diversity and acknowledgement and respect of the variety of cultures which constitute the spirit of India. The event was coordinated by Dr. A. Malathi.

***xix. A two-day National Seminar on Empowering Elderly in Vulnerable Constituencies: Role of State and Civil Society***

The seminar was organised by the Department of Social Work in collaboration with National Institute of Social Defence under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> of February, 2018. The seminar provided an interactive space to eminent academicians, practitioners, policy makers, researchers and social scientists to delve into the diversity of themes that require reflection and articulation on various issues related to the elderly; to sensitize the functionaries to pledge against discrimination, injustice, stereotypes, prejudices, abuse and violence against the elderly; raise public consciousness on the issues of blind spots in public policy and encouraging dialogue on integration, rehabilitation and empowerment of the elderly. Through three technical sessions and five parallel sessions; seventy eight experts and paper presenters deliberated upon the relevant themes. Students from various Universities and colleges actively participated in poster presentations, short films and photo essay competitions. Students depicted the problem of loneliness among elderly through a play titled, "*Phir Ek Nayi Subaha*". The Seminar was coordinated by Dr. Archana Kaushik.

***xx. Closing Ceremony of Shiksha Sahyogi Mela***

Indus Action, an organization working across Delhi NCR on Right to Education, particularly on the issue of admissions under EWS category organized a closing event in collaborations with Department of Social Work for women entrepreneurs (Shiksha Sahyogis) on 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2018. The welcome address was given by the CEO of Indus Action, Mr. Tarun Cherukuri. Around 250 women entrepreneurs participated in this

event from different communities of Delhi (NCR). The participants shared their experiences and success stories on education from their own communities. Followed by a panel discussion, the Shiksha Sahyogis were felicitated with a token of gratitude and appreciation. The event was coordinated by Mr. Sudhir Maske.

#### ***xxi. Women's Day celebration***

The Department in collaboration with the Comparative Federalists Research Group, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi and Sanskriti Foundation, an organization working for the development and empowerment of women, organised a felicitation ceremony on the occasion of International Women's Day on 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2018 to honour women who have made contributions in different realms of women empowerment and have excelled in different walks of life. The women exemplars such as Padma Shri Ms. Santosh Yadav (Indian Mountaineer), Ms. Shabnam Hashmi (Social Activist & Human Right Campaigner), Dr. Bharati Sharma (Working in the area of child protection and women empowerment), Ms. Rumeli Dhar (Indian Women International Cricketer), Mr. Sunil Jaglan (Who initiated the idea of selfie with daughter) and Dr. Alana Golmei (Founder of Pann Nu Foundation) graced the occasion. The programme began with the welcome speech by Prof. Sanjai Bhatt. This was followed by the launch of "Gendering Federalism in India by Prof. Rekha Saxena" Occasional Paper Series, Forum of Federations, Ottawa, Canada; Nari Shakti Awards, 2018 to the dignitaries; motivating words and sharing of experiences by the dignitaries; intellectual session with the audience; documentary titled "*From Struggle to Success*" and a speech by Dr. Sanjoy Roy. The Chief Guest on the occasion were Ms. Preeti Aggarwal, Mayor, North MCD and Ms. Kanika Sandeep Jain, Deputy Chairperson, Rohini Zone, North MCD. The vote of thanks was given by Dr. Sonia Goyal, President, Sanskriti Foundation. Dr. Sanjoy Roy coordinated the event.

### ***B. International Associations and Prospective Collaborations***

**i. Asian Pacific Association for Social Work Education (APASWE):** The Department has become a member of APASWE. This membership shall be meaningful in facilitating international collaborations for the Department.

**ii. Campbell Collaboration** is an international research network which publishes high quality systematic reviews of social and economic interventions around the world. The Department has a collaborative programme with this organisation. Under the aegis of the collaboration, meaningful sessions like those on *Systematic Reviews and Meta Analysis in Social Work Practice* were held in July, 2017. A Seminar for the faculty and research scholars of the Department on *Evaluations and Evidence Synthesis for Social Programmes: Improving Development Effectiveness through Impact Evaluation and Evidence Synthesis* was held on 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2018, wherein senior international specialists on evaluation and evidence synthesis coached the participants.

**iii. University of Calgary (Internship Programme):** The Department received Dr. Janki Shankar from the Faculty of Social Work, University of Calgary to interact with its students and faculty in the year 2017. The Department is considering the initiation of talks to participate in the Queen Elizabeth Scholars Program, under which the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute of which University of Delhi is a member can offer scholarships to enable Masters and PhD students to pursue courses as visiting students.

**iv. University of New Zealand:** Under the aegis of the New Zealand Academic Guest Lecture Series for students, Prof. Mark Henrickson from the School of Social Work, Massey University, New Zealand delivered a talk on *International definition and the internationalisation of social work* on 8<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. The lecture was organised by Education New Zealand, which is New Zealand's government agency for international education.

**v. University of South Australia:** Dr Sophie Diamandi, Faculty and Program Director, Student Well Being and Community Engagement from the School of Psychology, Social Work and Social Policy visited the Department in November, 2017 to explore the possibility of sending a group of students from their School to the Department for field exposure and orientation to social work services in 2018.

**vi. University of Brussels:** Two students from the University of Brussels visited the Department and interacted with the students and Faculty as part of a campaign on

sexual health and gender equality. They were selected for this campaign by the Flemish Government.

**vii. University of Maryland:** Five post graduate students in Social Policy from Maryland University USA, who were interning with *Katha* visited Department in the month January, 2018 for an interaction with the faculty.

### ***C. Using Theatre and Music as Expressions of Social Work Values***

During the year, the Department held a series of street plays, held a musical event and used theatre to underscore the core values of social work profession. These expressions highlighted the secular traditions of Indian culture, challenged the hegemony of the powerful and brought forth the voices of the marginalised. Some of the events held by the Department are mentioned below:

- i. The Play "A Woman Alone"**- The Theatre Society of the Department in association with Sukhmanch Theatre organised Dario Fo & Franca Rame's play "A Woman Alone" on 20<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. The play interrogated the different roles that a woman performs as per the expectations of the male chauvinist society. It questioned the entire social system and gender discrimination that exists in the society.
- ii. Secular Traditions in Hindustani Music and Poetry: A Musical Journey from 13<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> Century-** A music recital on the above theme was held in the Department on 13<sup>th</sup> January, 2018. A soulful performance by Subhendu Ghosh took the audience to a world of peace and harmony. The performance was facilitated by Mr. Pratap Behera.
- iii. Youthra 2** - A street theatre competition was held at the Department on 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2018 in partnership with PRIA and Khanabadosh. The street theatre competition focused on social issues confronting our society and drew response from various colleges of Delhi University.
- iv. The play "Akkarmashi"** - This play was staged by Mandala (magic circle) at the Department on the 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2018. The play was based on the autobiography of Shri Sharankumar Limbale, a Dalit writer from Maharashtra.

It was the first-person account of the struggle against poverty, deprivation, discrimination and violence and captured the dehumanizing impact of caste oppression in Hindu society. The play made beautiful use of words to bring out the suppressed anger, inferiority complex and anguish of the illegitimate child in the context of present social set up and caste system. The lead actor of the play was Mr. Lokesh Jain. The play was facilitated by Ms. Maitrayie Mishra of the second semester.

- v. **The Play, "Aiin"**- The Film and Theatre Society of the Department in collaboration with Adakari- Theatre festival of Daulat Ram College organised a play titled 'Aiin' by Kamla Nehru College, University of Delhi on 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2018. The play focussed on a group of students who find that there are too many limitations to their right to express themselves. The play attempted to depict the leakages in different parts of the system in the society and the role of the majoritarian politics in shaping the social dynamics.

#### ***D. The Functioning of Department Committees***

The Department has constituted various committees for its smooth functioning. These committees contribute very positively to the corporate life of the Department. The initiatives undertaken by some of the committees during the year are given below:

- i. **Computer Committee** -The computer committee took up various issues related to the smooth functioning of the computer lab. The computer committee has created a separate mail id [socialworkcomputerlabdu@gmail.com](mailto:socialworkcomputerlabdu@gmail.com) for registering computer related official complaints/repair and a request /complaints form has also been created and circulated among the staff and faculty members for this purpose. The committee also took up the issue of AMC, infrastructure requirements such as furniture and the cleanliness of the lab. A students' volunteer committee has been formed to take up issues such as appropriate use of the computer lab and maintenance of discipline.
- ii. **Library Committee**- The library committee held regular meetings and accomplished the following tasks. It installed a plagiarism testing software *Urkund* in the Department library. One library staff received training for

operating the software from the University. It streamlined the purchase of books for the library by seeking suggestive list of books from the faculty and consistently following up. It worked towards resolving administrative issues for smooth functioning of the library such as the modalities of fine payment for late submission of books and clearing the stock of old books.

- iii. Committee for the North East Students-** The committee held a series of meetings with the North East Students in the Department looking at the issues and challenges being faced by them; both within and outside the Department and possible interventions. The students came up with requests for an orientation session as some of them had joined the Department late. Also, some have difficulties in communicating in Hindi Language. In order to help them build their vocabularies and develop their language abilities, Hindi language story books from National Book Trust were purchased and placed in the library of the Department for ease of access.
- iv. Committee against Sexual Harassment-** The Committee against Sexual Harassment (CASH) and Gender Sensitization is a mandatory requirement under the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. As part of the orientation programme 2017, the Committee organized sessions on creating awareness on the provisions of the Act and the meaning of sexual harassment for both the first and the third semester students and the staff. The resource persons were both from within the Department and experts invited from outside. A session by CEO of *Safety pin*; Dr. Kalpana Vishwanathan was organised to apprise the students about public safety and its various parameters along with informing them about the unique mobile App for making public spaces safe for women.
- v. Canteen Committee-** The Canteen Committee was proactive throughout the year. Paying heed to the feedback of the students, faculty and the staff, it invited a fresh tender to run the canteen. A new contractor is now managing the canteen. It has also been renovated and has new furniture.



## VIII. STUDENT'S INITIATIVES

The student community of the Department has initiated a number of activities at the Department. Some of these are given below:

- A. *Ambedkar Memorial Lecture Committee-*** AML is a body of students from both M.A. previous and M.A. final. The group has been formed on the ideals of Baba Saheb Ambedkar. The group has been actively holding friendly discussions on various socio political issues concerning the society at large. In 2017, the students held various meetings and discussions one of them being in the memory of Gauri Lankesh.

The Ambedkar Memorial Lecture Committee under the guidance of Mr. Sudhir Maske also organised the third Annual Ambedkar Memorial Lecture on 21<sup>st</sup> April, 2017. The panel discussion focussed on the theme *Dalit Identity: Emerging Social Coalitions of Marginalised Communities*. Prof. Anand Teltumbde, Professor, educationist and writer and Prof. Sanghmitra S. Acharya; Professor and Director, Indian Institute of Dalit Studies led the discussion. This was followed by a play by Sukhmanch Theatre Group titled *Court Martial*.

- B. *Milestones: Department Newsletter-*** The Department runs an annual bilingual newsletter that provides a platform to the students to voice their opinions and experiences in an innovative and creative way. It was decided to bring out the newsletter bi-annually from this year; one issue per semester. The issue for the months July-December, 2017 titled *Milestones: Creating Reverberations* consisted of a compilation of articles, paintings, doodles and photographs contributed by the students, teachers and field work supervisors on social issues and personal experiences. The next issue for the month of January – April 2018 is in process. Prof. Sanjai Bhatt, Dr. Meenu Anand, Dr. Seema Sharma and Mr. Pratap Behera were the faculty mentors; along with Mr. Rahul Kapoor as the student guide. The designing team consisted of Ms. Ayushi D. Lal and Ms. Elika Anand.

- C. *Student Blog- Bebak Batkahi;*** the student blog is a space where the students are encouraged to explore various aspects of their personality. The term *Bebak Batkahi* essentially means 'unabashed conversation'. The blog provides a space to express oneself freely and also showcase talent on a common platform. It welcomes a variety

of content and expressions; from political perspectives to doodles, from poetry to interviews. While *Bebak Batkahi* is essentially a medium of expression in writing, it intends to broaden its reach from the digital world to real world. The blog can be checked out at <https://bebakbatkahi.wordpress.com>. It is administered by Ms. Maitrayie Mishra and Ms. Aparna Tiwari of the second semester.

**D. *The Photography Club***- It is a loosely knit body of the budding photographers who held an exhibition of their photographs on 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2018 in the Department lawns. Ms. Elika Anand, Ms. Nishtha Singh, Ms. Shweta Yadav and Mr. Tejaswin Sharma showcased their creativity through photographs which captured an intense sensitivity towards nature and life.

**E. *The Film and Theatre Society*** -The main objective of the Film and Theatre Society is the production and promotion of theatrical plays, short films and other performing arts such as dance and music with a special focus and concentration on Indian arts. The Society actively conducts events through either theatrical plays or film screenings. It also has a special feature, wherein it collaborates with other theatre societies and stages plays in the communities. The Society has staged many plays and film screenings in the Department. Some of these are screening of two documentaries namely; '*The Hunt*' and '*The Black Power Mix Tape*' and two plays namely; '*A Woman Alone*' and '*AJIN*'. The members of Film and Theatre Society are Mr. Deepak Yadav, Ms. Megha Choppari, Mr. Sandeep Rajpal, Mr. Shantanu Singh Gaur, Ms. Sharanya, Ms. Shivi Upadhyay, Ms. Shweta Yadav, Mr. Sonu and Ms. Srishti Ghai.

**F. *Prof. Shankar Pathak Society for Environment Action***- Prof. Shankar Pathak Society for Environment Action is a group of students who are passionate about environmental issues. Through their activities and initiatives, they intend to propagate sustainable practices. The society is a thirty six member open group which is divided into four teams namely, Resource Mobilization Team, Social Media Team, Action Team and Planning and Coordination Team. Till now the group has advocated for ecological justice and has run some online campaigns. They have successfully conducted a waste audit of the Department and are propagating for waste segregation at its origin. The Society is working to install a compost pit and has also organized a plantation drive in the Department Campus. It has collaborated with different colleges and Departments of the University to take the initiative forward.

## **IX. ACADEMIC WORK BY FACULTY MEMBERS**

Individual faculty members actively seek opportunities to engage with and add to the body of knowledge in their chosen fields.
